(Peihsuan)






Even though it's the last week the children have come to school full of energy and participating in lots of activities. We are so proud of the children who have kept up their excellent attendance.



Year 2 Oryx




Year 2 Oryx had a fantastic final week and completed their year smiling.


In mathematics, we revisited addition and subtraction and then we challenged ourselves to complete the next Number Club.








Year 3 Flamingos



Year 5 have had fun this week completing their finished stories and showing different classes around the art exhibition that they created. They have enjoyed learning new songs and working as a team to do a performance.










قام طلاب السنة الأولى بمراجعة حديث آداب الطعام ونفذوا نشاط ممتع على الحديث.
